

Ms. Margaret's Pre-School

This week in the 3-year-olds preschool class, the children finished working on the letter Nn and began working on the letter Oo.

The stories this week included *About Reptiles* by Cathryn Sill, *The Greedy Python* by Richard Buckley, and *All About Alligators* by Jim Arnosky

In Science, the children examined snakeskin shoes and pictures of snakes, and pictures of turtles in their habitat.

In math, the children compared measurements, made bracelets with nine beads, and put number cards in order.

Ms. Nancy's Pre-Kindergarten



This week the students learned about the letter O, by painting with oranges and orange carrots. The students enjoyed learning how to care for their teeth by deciding what kind of foods are healthy, how to properly brush, and what happens to teeth when they are not taken care of. Ask your child what happens to your teeth when you drink too much soda.

Ms. Kim's Class

This week the students finished their Hot Rod book. They played two games, one involved rhyming words and the other they played with a buddy, using the game pieces in the back of their book. They raced to see who would reach the finish line first. You can play the game with your child at home too. The students listened to a story about sharing. Make sure to ask your child about the story, *Hot Rod's Sharing Solution*. We also began the next Superkids book, *Us*, which is about all the Superkids. In math, the kindergarteners are busy working on addition. We are learning that addition means joining two groups together. We are also continuing to work on counting skills using our hundred chart. This week was also Ash Wednesday and the beginning of Lent. The students have talked about what happens on Ash Wednesday, what they will give up for Lent, and ways they can serve others during Lent.

Mrs. Sibick's Multi-age Classroom

First graders are learning to read, write, and spell contractions. They just read *The Spingle, Spangle Talent Show*. Soon they will begin the next unit called, *More Adventures of Superkids*. Second grade read the story *Alec Explains*. Ask your child what it is about. Cursive letters a and c were practiced this week. First grade students are learning how much 2 tens is (20). Second graders are double checking their subtraction with addition. For example, if $40-30=10$, then $30+10=40$. The Academy was very proud of students during church on Ash Wednesday. Our class will have *Our Promises for Lent* hanging in the hallway soon. Each student promised to work on something or give us something for Lent. The students are finishing up on a venn diagram of presidents and writing. They are working very hard. The students listened to two stories on the Smartboard. The books talked about presidents and Abraham Lincoln. Ask them to share a fact they learned. Have a great week!
